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Itinerary: 2018

Day 1. Sorano, Pitigliano and surrounding area. Both truly

spectacular Medieval hilltop towns off the beaten track. Photographing in these picturesque Etruscan towns starts the workshop off on a high note.

Day 2. Montepulciano, Pienza and surrounding area.

Montepulciano is most famous for its wines and location in the historic Valle di Orcia. Pienza a majestic hilltop town that is famous for its Pecorino/sheep Cheese and Historical importance. Both true jewels of SouthTuscany.

Day 3. Tuscania, Marta and

surrounding area. Tuscania is a classic fortress town with great views and fabulous architecture, Marta is a quaint fishing village

located on picturesque Lake Bolsena. A great place to photograph and meet the locals. Lunch at my favorite restaurant on the Lake. Great food priced for locals.

Day 5. Puccie's 11th Century castle Proceno...I get the key to Puccie's castle[these are my very good friends]we tour the castle tower, ramparts, shoot still life images in her 16th century salon, 11th century wine cellar, gardens etc. We start the day in Acquapendente for the Local Friday

Photography is an expressive art form that primarily relies on observational skills in relationship to light, form and composition. Foundational photographic skills including composition, lighting lens choice, camera function, will all be discussed and incorporated into this workshop. This workshop will be primarily taught in the field during our daily photographic excursions. There will be plenty of time for personal instruction, critiques as well as demo's. This

workshop is recommended for those shooting digitally, traditionally, and for anyone interested in honing their skills with their smart phone. accommodations. Orvieto is the closest town in the region with a train station. Orvieto will be your destination from there by car its just about forty five minutes to Proceno the area the workshop will be based from. It is not mandatory to rent a car. If you would like some independence from the group a car rental would be a very wise choice. Cars can be rented in Orvieto, nearby the train station or from Florence or Rome depending on where you land. I rent a van for our daily excursions and do the navigating. If you don't rent a car I will pick you up from the train station in Orvieto. I will arrange a pickup and drop off schedule, there will be a reasonably priced fee for the service both ways.
